Current situation requiring research: CHECK-LIST OF KEY POINTS TO COVER o What is already known, including market or customer base. o What the research has to answer. o Why this information is needed, and how it will be used. o Who will be using the research – key stakeholders? Any relevant information from previous research? o How **robust** must the answers be? o What will be the **controversies** or arguments surrounding the research or results? o Implications of answers gained o How good is the 'buy-in'? o Political issues to be wary of? o Key samples of interest What about their opposites, others not considered? o Resources available for the research E.g. customer lists, industry details, database history etc o Any methodological likes / dislikes? E.g. from bad experiences in the past?

When do you need the proposal by?

When do you need the **results** by? Toplines / full results?

Is the deadline due to an immovable date or some other reason? (How much 'slack' is there?)

Budget available?

Best to get some ball-park to avoid wasting everyone's time.

Competitive pitch?
