# **Exemptions from New Zealand Composition and/or Labelling Requirements Under the Food**

Act 2014 All food produced for sale in New Zealand must comply with the applicable composition and labelling requirements of the Australia New Zealand Food Standards

Code, and certain New Zealand-specific food standards. Sometimes, New Zealand requirements for composition and/or labelling differ from the importing country's requirements. In these cases, food businesses are currently required to submit an application to the

Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) to have

their food export exempted from New

Zealand composition and/or labelling requirements to meet the importing country requirements.


