Gene Technology Bill ExportNZ and the New Zealand International

ExportNZ/NZIBF Submission on

Business Forum (NZIBF) support the Government's overall intention to modernise New Zealand's gene technology regulations. We support the establishment of a risk-based regulatory regime governed by a newly established regulator and that is consistent with other international gene technology regulatory systems.

However, our organisations have several key

concerns regarding the potential risks to exporters' market access, the lack of impact analysis provided, and the proposed level of industry engagement with the gene technology regulator.
