Update from the Executive Director

Our eyes remain firmly on the United States and what may lie ahead on the trade policy front. After a flurry of tariff announcements and postponements earlier this month, things have gone a little guiet as the administration begins negotiating "deals" with some of the hardest-hit trade partners. New Zealand is not currently negotiating, having been hit with the minimum 10% tariff rate. You'll find more on this in this month's Trade & Advocacy Update below.

Speaking of the US, earlier this month I spoke with Stuff's Gill South about what early-stage exporters need to know when entering the U.S. market, how to diversify, and how businesses are already reacting to the new tariffs. You can check out the interview here.


